

ROLLS OF HONOUR

Rolls of Honour are usually lists of members of a community, village, church, sports club, work place etc. who served in the armed services.

In the First World War they were started in 1914 and added to as the years went on. They were often produced as a wall plaque or framed list. In some cases a cross was put alongside those personnel who had died during or as a result of the conflict.

Here we give a few local examples from churches, village halls or clubs. There is a very fine example in the Wauchope Hall in Yetholm which has been photographed and documented by Elizabeth and Graeme Watson.
