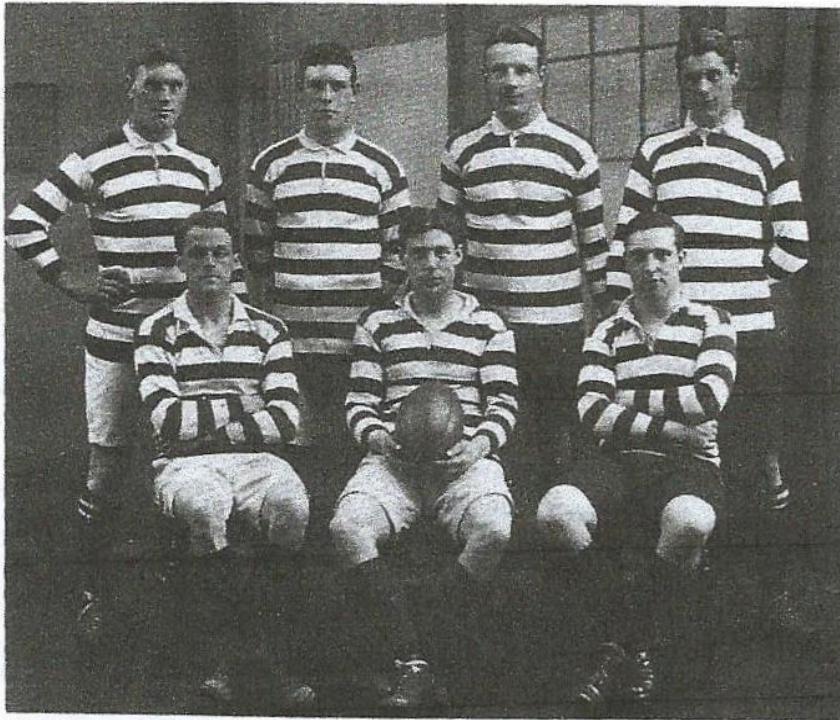


# KELSO RUGBY CLUB

## Back Row

1. G. Fletcher:-Survived the War and Played in Season 1919/1920
2. W. Steel:-Pte. William Steel K.O.S.B. Killed on 9<sup>th</sup> April 1917 in France. Buried Tillay British Cemetary, Tillay-le Mofflaines.
3. C. Robeson: Charles Robeson captained the Club in Season 1910-1911. Signed Rugby League in 1913 for Oldham. Survived the war, came back to work as a Saddler in Kelso
4. W. Spears Black:-Survived War and played until season 1923/24. When he first came on the scene in 1905 he was playing football for Kelso where he captained the Club.

## Front Row

5. W.T. Forrest:-Major Walter Forrest K.O.S.B. Killed in action in Palestine 19<sup>th</sup> April 1917, buried in Gaza War Cemetery. Won the MChE was first capped for Scotland in 1903 playing for Hawick. He won a further 7 caps before returning to play for Kelso in 1905. He became president of the club in 1910/11 for 3 years while also continuing to play.
6. Carl Ogilvy:-Survived the war. Captained the Club for two seasons 1912-1914. He was capped for Scotland in 1911/1912 while playing for Hawick. He played after the war and was a stalwart of the club.
7. A Bulman:-Lieut. Andrew Bulman K.O.S.B. Killed at Gallipoli 12<sup>th</sup> July 1915. Remembered on the Helles Memorial. He captained the Club in seasons 1908/09 and 1909/10. As well as being a player he was Hon. Sec. of the Club in 1913 and went to France as guest of the Scottish Rugby Union as "Piper" an obscure international honour.

G. Fletcher:-

Survived the War and Played in Season 1919/1920

W. Steel:-

Pte. William Steel K.O.S.B. Killed on 9<sup>th</sup> April 1917 in France. Buried Tillay British Cemetary, Tillay-le Mofflaines.

C. Robeson:-

Charles Robeson captained the Club in Season 1910-1911. Signed Rugby League in 1913 for Oldham. Survived the war, came back to work as a Saddler in Kelso

W. Spears Black:-

Survived War and played until season 1923/24. When he first came on the scene in 1905 he was playing football for Kelso

W.T. Forrest:-

Major Walter Forrest K.O.S.B. Killed in action in Palestine 19<sup>th</sup> April 1917, buried in Gaza War Cemetery. Won the MC

He was first capped for Scotland in 1903 playing for Hawick. He won a further 7 caps before returning to play for Kelso in 1905. He became president of the club in 1910/11 for 3 years while also continuing to play.

Carl Ogilvy:-
